

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.1722 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of VICTORIA COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.1722 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.1690 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.1835 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2023 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for VICTORIA COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT from the same properties in both the 2022 tax year and the 2023 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that VICTORIA COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that VICTORIA COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2023 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON August 14, 2023 AT 04:00 PM AT ROOM 101 OF ACADEMIC BUILDING, AT VICTORIA COLLEGE, 2200 E RED RIVER VICTORIA, TX 77901.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, VICTORIA COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the THE PRESIDENT'S OFFICE of VICTORIA COUNTY JUNIOR COLLEGE DISTRICT at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{Property tax amount} = (\text{tax rate}) \times (\text{taxable value of your property}) / 100$$
