In the ancient Mediterranean, wine was used in religious ritual prior to its becoming a social drink. Likely incorporated into religious rites because of its practical applications, such as the antiseptic properties it contributed to drinking water and as an aid to healing, wine was also a good use of grapes, which do not stay ripe long, but are indigenous to the region. As manufacture and storage of wine became easier, wine became less sacred and found its way into social environments as well. As the ancient civilizations of the Mediterranean established monotheistic religions, wine regained its religious importance in a variety of ways.
