Requirements & Take Courses for Transfer Credit



### Why Do We Research?

- $\checkmark\,$  Not all schools offer the same majors & programs.
- ✓ The same major at different schools will likely require/ prefer different courses.
- ✓ Certain programs & courses will require prerequisite courses.
  - Ex: College Algebra > Precalculus > Calculus I
- ✓ Many programs require courses to be completed with a certain letter grade & overall GPA.
- ✓ Courses offered at different institutions are often labeled differently.
  - o <u>Ex:</u> VC ENGL 1301 vs. UT RHE 306
- ✓ To take classes at VC that best align with the expectations of the transfer institution & your educational goals.
- ✓ To maximize the number of credits that transfer & are applicable to your degree requirements.



# **Step 1: Find Transfer Admission Requirements**

- Although you may not attend your transfer institution right away, it's important to know what guidelines you must meet to be eligible in the future.
- Let's pretend I'm interested in Texas State and the University of Texas – Austin as potential transfer schools.







### **Coursework & Program Keywords**

### **Step 3: Find Course Equivalencies (if possible)**

- As we briefly mentioned, institutions do not always use the same labeling system for courses which can make it difficult to match courses for transfer.
- So how can we tell if VC's ENGL 1301 is the same as UT's RHE 306?
- Well we need to figure out how the transfer institution does their course equivalency.
  - For example:
    - UT Austin uses an <u>Automated Transfer Equivalency System</u>
    - <u>A&M</u>, <u>Sam Houston</u> & <u>Texas State</u> all use their own equivalency system.
    - TAMUCC & UTSA use the <u>Texas Common Course Number System (TCCNS)</u> as do many other schools.
    - Lamar uses <u>Transferology</u>.
    - Some schools, like <u>UNT</u>, list their courses out in the catalog while others provide equivalencies in their guides & degree plans that we viewed in Step 2.
