Introduction	 Hook: Grab the reader's attention!!! Start with a great opening sentence to get the reader's attention—a quote, an outrageous, surprising, or shocking fact, or a relevant statistic. Summarize Issue: Explain the Topic / Build Background / Brief Summary of the Issue. Thesis Statement: 3 reasons why someone should agree with you

4th Paragraph of Body	Counter Argument Summarize the reasons for the other side of the argument Introduce your evidence Evidence (remember to cite) Analyze/ Explain Evidence (How does the evidence you chose to support your thesis?) Closing Statement w/ Transition
Conclusion	Restatement of the thesis (in different words) or review of key points • Leave the reader with a strong image or impression of the topic • How the subject relates to anyone • Reader call to action (how do you want someone to support your argument)
